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The Doctrine of Holy Spirit

Within this section or within the course we will be defining the doctrine of Holy Spirit looking at the personality, the deity of the Holy Spirit and the names of the Holy Spirit, the work of the Holy Spirit and offenses against the Holy Spirit.

Introduction

Who is the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is the third person of the trinity and is the presence of God the Father and the God the Son who is the word of God. The Holy Spirit is not an impersonal power or force but an individual and apart of the God head. Jesus said in the word of God that he would not leave us comfortless according to John 14:18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you.¹

We cannot measure God by our own human standards, thinking because God is the creator. His presence is the Holy Spirit and therefore, you cannot even begin to understand the magnitude of who he is do us. The presence of God who is the Holy Spirit is closer that your mere breath. He is here because Father sent him and did not leave us comfortless by Jesus praying to the Father. John 14:16-18, 26-28 states "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever; 17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. 18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you. 26 But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. 27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. 28 Ye have heard how I said unto you, I go away, and come again unto you. If ye loved me, ye would rejoice, because I said, I go unto the Father: for my Father is greater than I."

In the beginning the spirit hoover over the face of the water is the first record with the Holy Bible of the Spirit of God. It was in the beginning God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit was together. Jesus came to earth, and it was God the Father and God the Holy Spirit in was in Heaven. When Jesus ascended into heaven and still up to today is God the Father and God the Son. When Jesus returns for His bride the Church to present His Bride to His Father; God the Holy Spirit will also return and the three of the Trinity - God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit will be together.²

In 1 Corinthians 2:10-11, God's attribute of omniscience is also present in the Holy Spirit: "these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

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For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God."³

The Holy Spirit is a part of the Spirit of the Father and the Spirit of the Son who is a magnificent, wonderful, splendid, glorious, and outstanding!⁴

The Holy Spirit appears synonymously with God in many places in the Bible, both in the New and Old Testaments. In Acts 5:3-4, Peter asks Ananias why he has lied to the Holy Spirit, and it is clear that lying to the Holy Spirit is the same as lying to God. He shares the characteristics of God, such as omniscience and omnipresence, as seen in Psalm 139:7-8, which says "Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!"⁵

The Holy Spirit is a divine person, and He is intimately involved in our salvation, along with the Father and the Son, as shown in Romans 8:11 which says, "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you." The Holy Spirit has thoughts and knowledge (1 Corinthians 2:10), and He can feel sorrow and grief (Ephesians 4:30). The Spirit can make intercession for believers (Romans 8:26-27). He also has a will and makes decisions (1 Corinthians 12:7-11).⁶

In summary, the Holy Spirit is God. He is the third person of the Trinity. Only as that divine person can the Holy Spirit be to believers a comforter and a counselor, according to the promise of Jesus (John 14:16,26; 15:26).⁷

- Knowledge - 1 Corinthians 2:10,11 - But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God.
- Will - 1 Corinthians 12:11- But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.
- Mind - Romans 8:27 - And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.
- Love - Romans 15:30 - Now I beseech you, brethren, for the Lord Jesus Christ's sake, and for the love of the Spirit, that ye strive together with me in your prayers to God for me;
- Intelligence and Goodness - Nehemiah 9:20 - Thou gavest also thy good spirit to instruct them, and withheldest not thy manna from their mouth, and gavest them water for their thirst.
- Grief - Ephesians 4:30 - And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

8. He comforts us (John 16:7)
9. He equips us with spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 12:4-7)
10. He fills us (Eph. 5:18)
11. He empowers us (Acts 1:8)

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The Holy Spirit's Work

What are the responsibilities of the Holy Spirit? How is the Holy Spirit function in our lives? How does the Holy Spirit operate in the world and the universe? How does the Holy Spirit effect you as a believer?

Within the World

According to John 16:8 states "And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment". It is here we see that the work of the Holy Spirit is convict, reprove, rebuke, admonish, reproach and chastises or discipline the world for sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.

To the Believers

The Holy Spirit works or functions as helper and comforter for us as believers. In John 14:16-17, 26-28 states "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever; 17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. 18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you. "He shall give you another Comforter" which in the Greek means helper. In Psalm 32:8 says "I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye." When does the Holy Spirit start being our comforter from the time, we ask Jesus to come into our hearts and when we give God our lives as noted in Romans 8:9-10 as well as in 1 Corinthians 6:10-20!

The Holy Spirit is also our guider and will guide us in all truth because in John 16:13 states "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come.

He represents the indwelling presence of God within us.

Not only does he guide us, comfort us, helps us but he also glorifies as it states in John 16:14 "He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you." We have a desire to worship God because of the Holy Spirit.

To the Scriptures

The Holy Spirit also gives special gifts according to the way he knows that we will use them. These gifts have been given for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of



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the body of Christ: working together as believers, by fulfilling the will of God for the needs of people, make disciples (followers, believers, and supporters who will glorify God.

See these scriptures for more references:

- 1 Corinthians 12:7 - But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal.
- Romans 12:3-8 - 3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith. 4 For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: 5 So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and everyone members one of another. 6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith; 7 Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching; 8 Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness.
- 1 Peter 4:10-11 - As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. 11 If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.
- Ephesians 2:10 - For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

The Fruit of the Spirit

The Holy Spirit has fruit of the Spirit which is found in Galatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." Then you operate in the fruit of the Spirit there is no law, no limitation, no hinderances, no lack. The fruit of the Spirit is what you give out and you may not get back from the person you gave it too.



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Quenching the Holy Spirit

We are living in a time where people of our communities, and churches has no respect for the Word of God, for God the Father, God the Son and either for the Holy Spirit. The people debate and compromise their way as it is but the Word of God is not to debated and compromised. "Sinning against the Spirit is fraught with terrific consequences". The offences against the Spirit under two general divisions, namely, those committed by the unbeliever, and those committed by the believer. Not that there is absolutely no overlapping in either case. For, doubtless, in the very nature of the case there must be. This thought will be kept in mind in the study of the offences against the Spirit."¹¹

Quenching the Holy Spirit by Sinners

1. They resist the Holy Spirit - Acts 7:51-57
2. Insulting or Despising the Holy Spirit - Hebrews 10:29
3. Blaspheming the Holy Spirit - Matthew 12:31-32 - This seems to be the most grievous sin of all, for the Master asserts that there is no forgiveness for this sin. Sins against the Son of Man may be forgiven because it was easily possible, by reason of His humble birth, lowly parentage, etc., to question the claims He put forth to deity. But when, after Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came, and presented to every man's conscience evidence sufficient to prove the truth of these claims, the man who then refused to yield to Christ's claims was guilty of resisting, insulting, and that amounts to blaspheming the testimony of the whole Godhead, of which the Spirit is the executive.¹²

Quenching the Holy Spirit by Believers

- Ephesians 4:30-31 - And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. ³¹Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamor, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:
- Isaiah 63:10 - But they rebelled, and vexed his holy Spirit: therefore, he was turned to be their enemy, and he fought against them.
- Galatians 5:17-19 - For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would. ¹⁸ But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law. ¹⁹ Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, ²⁰ Idolatry, witchcraft,

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hatred, variance, wrath, emulations, strife, seditions, heresies, ²¹ Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

As a believer, we can quench the Holy Spirit these eight (8) ways by:-

1. Living like the pagans - Ephesians 4:17-19
2. Lying - Ephesians 4:25
3. Being Angry - Ephesians 4:26-27
4. Stealing - Ephesians 4:28
5. Cursing - Ephesians 4:29
6. Being bitter - Ephesians 4:31
7. Being unforgiving - Ephesians 4:32
8. Being Sexually Immoral - Ephesians 5:3-5

To grieve the Spirit is to act out in a sinful manner, whether it is in thought only or in both thought and deed. Both quenching and grieving the Spirit are similar in their effects.¹³

Definitions of Gifts of the Holy Spirit

1 Corinthians 12:4-10 ~ Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues:

Administration

The gift of administration is the divine strength or ability to organize multiple tasks and groups of people to accomplish these tasks.

Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28

Apostleship

The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training.

Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14

Craftsmanship

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The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build, and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications.

Exodus 30:22, 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3

Discernment

The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood, to distinguish between right and wrong motives and the spiritual forces at work in situations.

Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; 1 John 4:1-6

Evangelism

The gift of evangelism is the divine strength or ability to help non-Christians take the necessary steps to becoming a born-again Christian.

Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14

Exhortation

The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to strengthen, comfort or urge others to action through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth.

Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25

Faith

The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life.

Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11

Giving

The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to produce wealth and to give by tithes and offerings for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth.

Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7, 9:2-7 65

Healing

The gift of healing is the divine strength or ability to act as an intermediary in faith, prayer, and by the laying-on of hands for the healing of physical, mental and spiritual sickness.

Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28

Helps

The gift of helps is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry with the ability to often see the need before others do.

Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28



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Hospitality

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for other sin places such as your home, office, or church.

Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9

Intercession

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace, believing for profound results.

Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; James 5:14-16

Word of Knowledge

The gift of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to bring truth to a situation by supernatural revelation. This is often accompanied by a word from God.

Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3

Leadership

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea.

Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17

Mercy

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way.

Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thess. 5:14

Miracles

The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction.

Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28

Pastor/Shepherd

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues.

John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3

Prophecy

The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to communicate God's truth and heart in a way that calls people to a right relationship with God.

Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:5



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Service

The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to do small or great tasks in working for the overall good of the body of Christ.

Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14

Teaching

The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the Scriptures primarily to bring understanding and depth to other Christians.

Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14

Tongues (and Interpretation)

The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. The gift of tongues is often accompanied by interpretation and should be used appropriately.

Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14

Word of Wisdom

The gift of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to understand and to bring clarity to situations and circumstances often through applying the truths of Scripture in a practical way.

Acts 6:3,10; 1 Corinthians 2:6-13, 12:8
