The Doctrine of Man

Within this section or within the course we will be defining the doctrine of Man dealing with the creation of man, the fall of man is in account of the fall, the narrative, the nature and the results of the fall.

Introduction

The Creation of Man

Man is first mentioned in the first book of the bible in Genesis chapter 1 in verse 26. Man was a thought and not created at this time. God's thoughts of man are of peace and not evil to give you an expected end. Jeremiah 29:11 states "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end"¹.

Man was created in the image and likeness of Us. We must explain the US (God the Father, God the Son which is the Person of God, and God the Holy Spirit which is the Presence of God). In the image means the shadow or outline of a figure. The likeness means a likeness, resemblance, similitude, and sameness of that shadow of Us. Man was made in the image and likeness of us. Genesis 1:26 And God said, let us make man in our image, after our likeness; Genesis 1:27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.²

God said about His creation it is not good man that man should be alone in Genesis 2:18 And the Lord God said, it is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him.

How God arrangements for man in

- 1 Corinthians 11:7 - For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, forasmuch as he is the image and glory of God: but the woman is the glory of the man³.
- Ephesians 4:21-24 - If so be that ye have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Jesus: ²²That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; ²³ And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; ²⁴ And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.⁴

- Colossians 3:10 - And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him:⁵
- James 3:9 - Therewith bless we God, even the Father; and therewith curse we men, which are made after the similitude of God.⁶

The Condition of Man

We must realize that things about man that is not like God which are as follows:

- God is Spirit
- God does not have man's passion
- God does not have the parts of a man
- David said in Psalm 17:15 states "As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness".⁷
- Man is not supremacy like God
- Man is made by God's fitness
- Man was gifted, brilliant and provided with intellectual aptitudes, capacities, and geniuses
- Man had both honorable and spiritual senses

Man was formed

Genesis 2:7 says And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.⁸ Notice that God formed man of the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life. Man was not form from the dirt of the ground by the dust of the ground. Think about driving on a dirt road and there is a lot of dust. That is what man was created with not the ground but the dust. When God finished forming man, He breathed into his nostrils the breath of life.

From all this it is evident that man's original state was not one of savagery. Indeed there is abundant evidence to show that man has been degraded from a very much higher stage. Both the Bible and science agree in making man the crowning work of God, and that there will be no higher order of beings here on the earth than man. We must not forget that while man, from one side of his nature, is linked to the animal creation, he is yet supra-natural a being of a higher order and more splendid nature; he is in the image and likeness of God. Man has developed not from the ape, but away from it. He never was anything but potential man. "No single instance has yet been adduced of the transformation of one animal species into another, either by natural or artificial selection; much less

has it been demonstrated that the body of the brute has ever been developed into that of the man. The links that should bind man to the monkey have not been found. Not a single one can be shown. None have been found that stood nearer the monkey than the man of today." Agassiz ⁹

About Man

Man was named by God and his name was Adam. Adam means man or red (Babylonian); the generic name for man, having the same meaning in the Hebrew and the Assyrian languages.

Adam is the name given to the first man, whose creation, fall, and subsequent history and that of his descendants are detailed in the first book of Moses (Genesis 1:27-chapter 5). "God created man [Hebrew: Adam] in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them."¹⁰

Adam was absolutely the first man whom God created. He was formed out of the dust of the Earth (and hence his name), and God breathed into his nostrils the breath of life and gave him dominion over all the lower creatures (Genesis 1:26; 2:7). He was placed after his creation in the Garden of Eden, to cultivate it, and to enjoy its fruits under this one prohibition: "Of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil thou shalt not eat of it; for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die." The first recorded act of Adam was his giving names to the beasts of the field and the fowls of the air, which God brought to him for this end.¹¹

Making of Eve

Afterwards, the Lord caused a deep sleep to fall upon him, and while in an unconscious state took one of his ribs and closed up his flesh again; and of this rib he made a woman, whom he presented to Adam when he awoke. Adam received her as his wife, and said, "This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man." She called her Eve, because she was the mother of all living.¹²

Adam's First Sin

Being induced by the tempter in the form of a serpent to eat the forbidden fruit, Eve persuaded Adam, and he also did eat. Thus, man fell, and brought upon himself and his posterity all the sad consequences of his transgression. The story of the Fall contains the great promise of a Deliverer (Genesis 3:15), the "first gospel" message to man. They were expelled from Eden, and at the east of

the garden God placed a flame, which turned every way, to prevent access to the tree of life (Genesis 3). How long they were in Paradise is matter of mere conjecture. Shortly after their expulsion Eve brought forth her first-born and called him Cain. Although we have the names of only three of Adam's sons (Cain, Abel, and Seth), it is obvious that he had several (and perhaps many) sons and daughters (Genesis 5:4). He died at the age of 930 years.¹³

Origin of the Human Race

Adam and Eve were the progenitors of the whole human race. Evidences of varied kinds are abundant in proving the unity of the human race. The investigations of science, altogether independent of historical evidence, lead to the conclusion that God, ...made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth... - Acts 17:26 NASB Compare Romans 5:12-21 and 1 Corinthians 15:22-49)...Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned... - Romans 5:12 NASB For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive. - 1 Corinthians 15:22 NASB¹⁴

The Fall of Man

The fall of man is not a Christianity thing but affects all human beings in all religions and it is still the problem of the fall and sin. Man's fall caused the sin of the World to be done.

Yet, the doctrine of the fall has a relation to Christianity that it does not have to other religions, or religious systems. The moral character of God as seen in the Christian religion far surpasses the delineation of the Supreme Being set forth in any other religion, and thus heightens and intensifies its idea of sin. It is when men consider the very high character of God as set forth in Christianity, and then look at the doctrine of sin, that they find it hard to reconcile the fact that God, being the moral Being He is, should ever allow sin to come into the world. To some minds these two things seem incompatible.¹⁵

The Description of the Fall

The account of the fall by man is found in Genesis the third Chapter giving the only full account of the calamity of not only man God's creation but human being or mankind. The Disposition of the Fall

- They were sinless being
- They are our first parents
- They intentional act of the will
- They had no sin
- They denial God's will
- They put their own will over God's
- They did not consider the marked margin
- They disregarded of the divine limits
- They a belief of Satan rather than a belief in God

The Solutions of the Fall

On Our First Parents Adam and Eve. The results of sin in the experience of our first parents were as follows: The ground was cursed, so that henceforth it would not yield good alone (Gen. 3:17). Sorrow and pain to the woman in child-bearing, and subjection of woman to the man (Gen. 3:16). Exhausting physical labor in order to subsist (Gen. 3:19). Physical and spiritual death (Gen. 3:19; 3:3; 5:5; Rom. 5:12). Of course, with all this came also a fear of God, a shame because of sin, a hiding from God's presence, and finally, an expulsion from the garden (Gen. 3:8-11, 32-24).¹⁷

Conclusion on the Doctrine of Man

1. All men, without respect of condition or class, are sinners before God.¹⁸
2. This universal sinful condition is vitally connected with the sin of Adam.¹⁹
3. The whole world rests under condemnation, wrath, and curse.²⁰
4. Unregenerate men are regarded as children of the devil, and not sons of God.²¹
5. The whole race of men are in helpless captivity to sin and Satan.²²
6. The entire nature of man, mentally, morally, spiritually, physically, is sadly affected by sin.²³
